



Property Crimes 2022 (88)





Crimes Against Persons 2022 (147)




Everson 100 Nooksack 47

Public Peace 2022 (180)





Juvenile Incidents 2022 (154)





Calls For Service 2022 (195)





All Service Calls 2022 (292)





Community Policing

In 2022, We began to resume more active and in-person Community Policing and Crime Prevention activities, as we were coming out of the challenges we faced during the pandemic.

The Everson Police Department was involved in several different aspects of public education and crime prevention in Everson and Nooksack. In 2022, the Everson Police Department received requests for educational talks, crime prevention talks and community safety presentations. We also hosted our first annual "Trunk or Treat" event on Halloween. We handed out candy, hot dogs, chips, and water. We also helped organize trick or treating in our downtown area, working with local businesses. This was a fun event and very well attended.

Public talks and information dissemination covered several topics including, but not limited to: Home Security, School Safety, Stranger Danger, Internet Safety and Awareness, School Career Day information, and Reporting Practices. We continue to share information and inform the public through the City of Everson Newsletter and our Department Facebook page. The Everson Police Department has maintained a great working relationship with our communities.

In 2022, the Department was awarded grant funds from different sources. These funds were used to acquire equipment, and there was also money secured for overtime expenses.



Everson Police Department Training 2022

The Everson Police Department takes pride in maintaining a high level of training throughout the year. Each Officer fulfilled the state mandated training for 2022.

Officer Chad Pleadwell continues to oversee our department's training, serving as our training coordinator, and he continues to do an excellent job.

The department's trainings consisted of, but were not limited to: Emergency Vehicle Driving, Community Oriented Policing, Crime Prevention, Gracie Survival Tactics, Impaired Driving Investigations, Legal Update, Firearms Training, Taser Certification, CPR and First Aid, Critical Incident Response, Patrol Procedures, Crisis Intervention, Hazardous Materials, Police One and Lexipol Policy Manual Daily Training Bulletins.

The Everson Police Department has consistently met and maintained this high level of training and will continue to do so in 2023.



Sex Offenders / Kidnapper Offenders 2022

The Everson Police Department maintains the responsibility of monitoring registered sex offenders and registered kidnappers within our community in cooperation with the Whatcom County Sheriff's Office.

Officer Charlton is responsible for the sex offender / kidnapper program. This function is overseen by the Chief of Police.

There are currently four (4) level 1 sex offenders living in Everson, and no level 1 sex offenders living in Nooksack. There is one (1) level 2 sex offender living in Everson.

Currently there are no level 3 sex offenders or registered kidnappers living within either city.

Everson Police Department Reserve Program

The Everson Police Department's Reserve Officer Program continued to be an invaluable asset to the Cities of Everson and Nooksack in 2022. The program is comprised of two sworn and commissioned Reserve Officers, who aid the department in several ways.

The Washington Administrative Code defines Reserve Officers in the following manner:


"Reserve Peace Officer" ... means any officer who does not serve as a law enforcement officer of this state on a full-time basis, but who, when called by such agency into active service, is fully commissioned on the same basis as full-time officers to enforce the criminal laws of this State.

Everson's Reserve Officers work on an unpaid, volunteer basis. In 2022, Officers Smit and Sterk served the cities of Everson and Nooksack on countless shifts, serving when coverage was limited, or as special needs arose. Officers Smit and Sterk aided full-time officers during calls for service and participated in proactive policing on a wide variety of incidents, including, but not limited to traffic stops, domestic violence incidents, warrant arrests, property crimes, checks of welfare, security checks, suspicious circumstances, extra patrol, and specialized details.

In 2022, Officers Smit and Sterk combined for a total of 514.75 hours of volunteer service, as well as hours of training.

The Everson Police Department is tremendously grateful for the service Officers Smit and Sterk provided, shift after shift, week in and week out, throughout this past year. Officer Sterk is one of the longest standing Reserve Officers to date with over 20 years of outstanding service.

For 2023, it is the department's hope that it can continue to rely on the exceptional dedication to community, pride of service, and donation of time, our volunteer Reserve Officers have provided in the past.





The annual report is created to inform our elected officials and the public as to the activity and diversity of our department. We are very proud of our personnel and the services we provide the communities of Everson and Nooksack.

The Everson Police Department will continue to strive to meet the goals and expectations of the community and will continue to work diligently to keep our community safe.
